## World Language Department Bedford Central School District Philosophy Statement

The Bedford Central School District World Language Program believes the study of languages other than English is an essential component of students' complete educational experience. We strive to instill a sound linguistic and cultural foundation in all students in order to best prepare them for life and the global realities of the 21<sup>st</sup> century. The interdependent nature of today's world requires all individuals to acquire the skills needed for cross-cultural communication, understanding and appreciation. Language learning, and its accompanying cultural study, inherently broadens students' perspective and enhances their ability to understand and accept both the universal and unique aspects of the panorama of our world's varied societies. It provides students the opportunity to gain a deeper and richer concept of self as well as a greater appreciation for their own culture. We believe that students of all abilities and backgrounds should have the opportunity to acquire second language proficiency so they are best prepared for an informed and productive role in the world community and global marketplace. The population of the Bedford Central School District represents and embodies today's world cultures. The World Language Department plays an inextricable role in recognizing, celebrating and advocating the strength of our diversity. Language is our connection to our community and to our world. Our instruction is student-centered, interactive, communicative and performance-based. The standards that guide our approach are the five primary goals of second language acquisition: communication, cultures, connections, comparisons and communities.
