Standardized Testing



- PSAT
 - ALL Juniors October 2024 will be a computer-based exam
 - Some sophomores took the PSATs this October
- SAT <u>www.collegeboard.org</u> (computer-based)
- ACT <u>www.act.org</u> (paper and pencil)
- SAT Subject Test NO LONGER OFFERED

Testing Options and Dates

- Students do not take all tests
- Check out <u>differences</u> between the two SAT is a new format!
- Develop an individual plan with counselor
- Many schools are still test optional due to COVID no predictions on what the future holds
 - (<u>www.fairtest.org</u> provides a nice up to date list of test optional schools)
- Consider a practice ACT/SAT in Spring/Summer 2024 through an online resource or a local test prep company (Optional)
- **Fee waivers** are available through Guidance for students who qualify for Free/Reduced Lunch
- Students who receive test accommodations should reach out to their counselor about applying for accommodations for either exam (3-4 months prior to first exam)



Test Options and Dates

continued

11th & 12th grade:

- PSAT (October 2024) students can use Khan Academy when ready/if desired
- Select the SAT or ACT as the primary exam (most students take exam 1-3x's)
- Potential SAT Dates
 - Junior: December 2024, March 2025, May 2025, June 2025
 - Senior: August 2025, October 2025
- Potential ACT Dates
 - Junior: December 2024, February 2025, April 2025, June 2025
 - Senior: July 2025 (no NY), September 2025



Test Prep



- Khan Academy
 - <u>Free</u> SAT prep website with a direct partnership with The College Board (SAT).
- Kaplan
 - The ACT has a direct partnership with Kaplan for test prep (includes some free components).
- Local <u>Test Prep</u> Companies (not endorsed by FLHS)
- No one method guarantees results
- Academics should take priority

Naviance



- Naviance is a college and career readiness program which will be used heavily during college admissions.

- 10th grade Naviance Focus Career interest inventories which match interest and personality types with career clusters
 - Students will have several different Career and Interest Inventories they can take this spring which will all recommend various careers/areas of interest to pursue

Naviance (continued)



- 11th grade Naviance Focus College search, comparative tool for researching different colleges
 - Naviance houses FLHS statistics for college decisions
- 12th grade Naviance Focus Continue to research various colleges, conduit to send application materials to colleges
 - Seniors request transcripts and teacher letters of recommendation through Naviance
- Parents can access all of the college statistics on Naviance as well as conduct college searches, review student career assessments, etc.

Group Guidance

- Counselors will start to meet in small groups with sophomores in the spring (Q4)
- Focus on: Careers, Standardized Testing, Extracurricular Activities, Creation of Resume, Naviance, etc.
- Counselors will continue to meet with students in Group Guidance throughout high school
- Students should make individual appointments if/as needed
